Mary Stone was an exceptional woman, in every sense of the word. She was truly

active when it came to championing the causes close to her heart and Double Joy were blessed with her support. Mary's faith and profession were key to understanding who Mary was. She had been a teacher, headteacher and teacher-trainer, not only teaching children but also developing teachers' abilities to deliver excellent religious education. 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# **Carrying Double Joy Forward** By Clinton Omondi Ongidi (*Double* Joy 2004-2011)



Saturday, November 11, 2004, will always stand out as one of the most defining moments of my life. Stepping through that green gate, welcomed by the joyful faces of children waiting to receive us in the hall, I felt a mix of emotions. I was sad to see my grandfather (now departed) leave us in a new environment, yet I was elated to see happy faces of children who seemed just like me. What first seemed like a strange new environment quickly became my home. From morning assemblies to evening prayers, and sharing supper together as a family, **Double** Joy shaped my identity and gave me a sense of belonging.

I completed my primary education in 2011 and proceeded to Rang'ala Boys' High School, where I successfully finished my secondary education. Later, I joined Chuka University to pursue a Bachelor of Commerce in Banking and Finance. I graduated in 2020 and was honored to be featured in the 2020 winter newsletter, which highlighted my journey.

Since completing my education, I can confidently attest that the values instilled in me at Double Joy have profoundly influenced my career and the choices I have made. Beyond discipline, honesty, and hard work, living and learning alongside children from diverse families taught me empathy, resilience, and the importance of community. These lessons shaped not only my character but also my professional outlook.

Today, I work with businesses across Kenya, helping shape their success stories. In my role as an investment advisor, I support small and medium enterprises (SMEs) by offering accounting and investment solutions, tax guidance, and financial projections. I see this work not just as a career, but as a calling to extend the same support and hope that Double Joy once gave me.

My decision to focus on SMEs was influenced by a report from the Kenya National Bureau of Statistics, which revealed that 46.3% of businesses close within their first year of operation, and 70% fail within the first three years. These numbers were more than statistics to me; they represented families losing livelihoods, dreams cut short, and communities left vulnerable. This alarming rate of failure motivated me to help entrepreneurs increase their chances of survival. My goal has always been to bring a "double joy" to business owners by ensuring their ventures succeed. I achieve this through services such as bookkeeping, tax preparation, audits, and financial forecasting, while also walking alongside entrepreneurs as a partner in their journey.

As I share my journey to inspire other children at the institution, *I remain forever grateful* for the support I received from Double Joy, under the stewardship of Madam Mary Hinde. the donors led by FODJ, and the dedicated staff led by Mr. Atin. My special gratitude also goes to John Jackson's family, who will soon commemorate the seventh anniversary of his passing. John Jackson was a pillar in my education; his sponsorship enabled me to complete both my secondary and tertiary studies. Their support has shaped my identity and empowered me to contribute positively to Kenya's growth and transformation.



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### The Manager's Report:

The children are doing well. 60 live on site, cared for by 25 staff in total. 16 new children arrived in November in direct replacement for the fifteen October leavers (7 boys and 9 girls, ages ranging from 4-10 years.) One new youngster needed critical treatment for a previous severe eye injury and now has an artificial replacement. 56 attend local primary schools (either Ruma or Dagamoyo). One boy attends special school for the Blind and two more attend the nearby Madiany Special School. Off site we continue support for 59 young people; six students at Vitech Training Institute as boarders, 29 at day Secondary Schools to stay at Double Joy during school holidays. 20 students live in boarding (Secondary) schools. 2 learn at nearby Rarieda Training Institute (Rafiki Waendeleo).

In September, Boaz Adhiambo volunteered to sponsor the construction of green house shed in the institution. The green house was completed in October. We planted variety of vegetables that are consumed by the children; this has helped to cut cost on the vegetables. I am delighted to report that the greenhouse has been exceptionally

successful, with bumper crops of spinach and kale being produced. (Photo overleaf).

On 21st November, we celebrated Children Service Month which was organised by the Judiciary and Double Joy was the host. If you could sponsor one of our students we always need new donors. ## **Treasurer's Report:**

We continue to send £8,150 per month to Double Joy for general running expenses. The extra coats since May have been £1,000 for buildings and staff insurance, £710 for a hospital bill for a child who needed an operation and £30 for the bio gas repair. The other extra costs have been for Children in Secondary School and V-tech training.

We are receiving about £4,000 per month in regular standing order donations, we have had two new standing orders set up recently. Our 'Just Giving' donations amount to about £100 a month some of which are regular giving. Our one-off donations have varied in amount from while living at home with family. They come £10 to £5,000, some of these have been due to fundraising by our supporters. As you can see, we rely on the one-off donations to top up the monthly amount we send to Double Joy. If anyone feels that they can give regularly or increase their regular giving, then it will help us to be able to budget more effectively.
